The Castle Peak Power Station incident this morning caused no injury Power supply remains normal

At about 7:45am this morning, a transformer bay inside one of Castle Peak Power Station's generation unit was found on fire and activated the automatic fire extinguishing system. Fire Services Department was called on site immediately and put off the fire at around 8:15am. No workers were in the vicinity of the transformer bay at the time of the incident and no one was injured. Power supply was unaffected. An investigation is being conducted to identify the incident's root cause.
