Twelve Po Leung Kuk Schools Recognised as Green Elites Campus Students and Teachers Join Hands to Go Green

Twelve Po Leung Kuk primary schools have been awarded Green Elites Campus accreditation after organising a series of environmental activities and energy saving exercises under the CLP Power Hong Kong Limited (CLP Power) **Green Elites Campus Accreditation Programme**. Four of the schools received the programme's Most Outstanding Award at a presentation ceremony on 17 October for their exceptional performance.

A new accolade, the Most Creative Award, was also awarded for the first time to a school which took the initiative to coordinate with other primary and secondary schools in the same district for a joint green activity, creating synergy and maximising the impact.

Seven teachers were given awards for their dedication to green education, and three students were presented with the Most Outstanding Green Elites Award under the Green Elites Portal and Award Scheme, while two primary schools received the Most Active Participation School Award.

Students and teachers from the schools which won the Most Outstanding Award now have the opportunity to join Green Power nature tours to Tai O, the Sharp Island Geopark, or the Nam Sang Wei wetland area. (See appendix for full details of winners.)

Speaking at the ceremony, CLP Power Managing Director Mr Chiang Tung Keung said: "CLP Power is committed to promoting energy saving to the public. We have incorporated key messages on environmental protection, energy conservation, and the power industry in our green education programmes, which cover the entire education pathway from kindergarten to university. The **Green Elites Campus Accreditation Programme** encourages schools to go green and helps primary school students to learn and apply green knowledge in their daily lives."

CLP Power has teamed up with Po Leung Kuk for the past two academic years to run the **Green Elites Campus Accreditation Programme**, reaching more than 17,000 students. Chairman of Po Leung Kuk Schools' Supervisors Committee Miss Abbie Chan said: "I would like to thank CLP Power for organising the programme to promote energy saving in 23 of our schools. Students have learnt a lot and have benefitted greatly from the programme."

A total of 34 primary schools have been named as Green Elites Campuses since the programme was launched in the 2014/15 academic year. In order to receive Green Elites Campus accreditation, participating schools must complete more than half of the required tasks on an environmental protection assessment checklist.

In the current academic year, CLP Power, in partnership with the Hong Kong Sheng Kung Hui Welfare Council (SKH), is working with Friends of the Earth (HK) and Green Power to implement the programme in 17 of its primary schools, bringing environmental education to a further 13,000 students. Learning activities and tools promoting environmental protection are made available, encouraging students to live greener lifestyles and to encourage their families and friends to go green. The Green Elites Portal has also been opened to the public, allowing students to learn about and adopt green lifestyles through fun games and interactive content at any time.
