Seventeen Sheng Kung Hui Schools Recognised as Green Elites Campus Embracing Low-Carbon Lifestyles Together

CLP Power Hong Kong Limited (CLP Power) today presented **Green Elites Campus accreditation** to 17 Sheng Kung Hui (SKH) primary schools in recognition of their efforts to promote environmental education to pupils in the 2017/18 academic year. More than 13,000 students took part in a broad range of green education activities. Four of the schools received the Most Outstanding Award for their exceptional performances. Pupils from those schools will join Green Power nature tours to Sharp Island Geopark, Hoi Ha Wan Marine Park, or the Nam Sang Wei wetland area. *(See appendix for full list of winners.)*

Since its launch in the 2014/15 academic year, the **Green Elites Campus Accreditation Programme** has provided energy saving and environmental protection assessment checklists and education tools to primary schools. It has arranged a series of activities, including school talks, visits to CLP facilities, energy audits, as well as an online Green Elites Portal for pupils. By taking part in the programme, students learn energy saving knowledge in a fun and interactive way and adopt green habits in their daily lives at a young age. To date, 51 primary schools have completed more than half of the required tasks on the environmental protection assessment checklist and have been recognised as Green Elites Campuses.

In the current academic year, CLP Power has continued its partnership with Anglican (HK) Primary Schools Council Limited, Friends of the Earth (HK), Green Power and The Green Earth to organise environmental awareness activities, helping students from 18 SKH primary schools adopt low-carbon lifestyles and share the message with their families and friends.

CLP Power has a long-term commitment to promote energy saving to young people through a variety of green education programmes, covering the entire education pathway from kindergarten to university.

Twenty-one students from SKH Fung Kei Millennium Primary School, one of the winners of the Most Outstanding Award (Gold), became Food Waste Auditors and discussed food saving measures with teachers, parents, and lunch box suppliers. They made promotion videos and successfully reduced food waste by 27% in the 2017/18 academic year when more than half of students left zero waste from their daily lunch boxes.

Most Outstanding Award (Gold) winner SKH Kei Hin Primary School arranged to collect second-hand items from students, including books, stationery, and household products, and set up a trading booth for parents' day. Money raised by the booth was used for the school's green education development while leftover items were donated to charitable organisations. Senior students also used CDs, fabrics, and other waste materials to decorate paper recycling bins in classrooms.

Most Outstanding Award (Bronze) winner SKH Yautong Kei Hin Primary School organised a Green Day when they worked with green groups, community organisations, secondary school and Parent-Teacher Association to set up booths and workshops, teaching students to make umbrella stands and vases with recycled plastic bottles and demonstrating electricity generation with salt water. A neighbouring kindergarten was invited to take part in the event at the school to help spread the green message to even younger pupils.

Most Outstanding Award (Bronze) winner SKH Fung Kei Primary School staged a green fashion show where students used recycled materials such as wrappers and nylon bags to produce clothes with their parents. The contest promoted recycling and highlighted the need to reduce waste.
