Caring CLP Customers Save 32 GWh of Electricity in Four Years through Power Your Love Programme

CLP Power Hong Kong Limited (CLP Power) has held the **Power Your Love** programme for four consecutive years to encourage customers to save energy and at the same time help people in need. More than 650,000 residential customers have since taken part, reducing energy bills for tens of thousands of underprivileged people and saving around 32 GWh of electricity during hot summers.

Launched in 2015, **Power Your Love** is a world-first initiative that uniquely marries energy saving with a mission to help the less fortunate in society. CLP Power donates the equivalent amount of electricity saved by participating customers to families in need.

Every year, around 20,000 households including single elderly people and elderly couples, disabled people, the families of boarders in special schools, and families living in subdivided units have been given grants of HK\$300 to offset against their electricity bills. Around 32 GWh of electricity has been saved in four years, equivalent to the energy consumption of over 7,300 families in a year. CLP shareholders have donated a total of HK\$24 million to support the beneficiaries of the programme.

CLP Power Managing Director Mr T K Chiang said, "According to statistics from the Hong Kong Observatory, the mean daily maximum temperature has been above 31 degrees Celsius during the **Power Your Love** programme over the past four years. About one third of our residential customers have nevertheless taken part, saving energy during the extreme hot weather and reflecting an increasing awareness about the importance of energy conservation.

"In view of the widespread public support for the **Power Your Love** programme, we are launching **Power Connect** under the new Scheme of Control Agreement. The new initiative also aims to save energy and help people in need, so as to further encourage energy saving and caring. As well as extending the programme period, we will introduce more elements in daily life to encourage participation and support more underprivileged households."

"We would like to express our sincere gratitude to the Social Welfare Department and the non-governmental organisations for supporting **Power Your Love** over the past four years and nominating beneficiaries for the programme to help," Mr Chiang added.

The **Power Connect** programme will be launched in January 2019, encouraging customers to reduce electricity use throughout the year and embrace sustainable, low-carbon lifestyles. Participants who save energy will have the chance to win fabulous rewards and choose the disadvantaged group they want to support. The fund will subsidise the electricity expenses of an estimated 40,000 households including single elderly people and elderly couples, disabled people, low-income families and people living in subdivided units each year.
