Green Businesses and Organisations Applauded at CLP Smart Energy Awards

CLP Power Hong Kong Limited (CLP Power) today held a second annual presentation ceremony to honour the winners of its **Smart Energy Award** programme, recognising the outstanding performance of Hong Kong businesses and organisations in energy management and the use of renewable energy and smart technology.

Awards were given in four categories – Energy Saving Performance, Peak Demand Management, Renewable Energy, and Smart Technology. They were divided into two sectors, one for corporate and government bodies, and the other for small and medium-sized enterprises (SMEs), non-governmental organisations (NGOs), and education institutes.

Judges selected 35 winners from more than 350 entries for their outstanding energy-saving performance and innovative practices. In addition, five businesses and organisations received a Renewable Energy Contribution Award for supporting the development of renewable energy in Hong Kong. Since the launch of the new Feed-in Tariff scheme last year, there have been steady growth in newly connected renewable energy generation systems. More than 4,200 solar panels have been installed at the Drainage Services Department's Siu Ho Wan Sewage Treatment Works, which are expected to generate 1.1 GWh of electricity a year to supply power to the department's facilities.

A smart monitoring system was installed this year to monitor the solar system's operation and performance so as to enhance the supply reliability, and the project has been recognised as a showcase for the application of renewable energy and won the Renewable Energy Grand Award in the Corporate/Government Bodies sector.

There has also been an encouraging rise in the number of businesses adopting smart technology to improve their energy efficiency. LHGroup won the Smart Technology Grand Award in the Corporate/Government Bodies sector by installing a Smart A/C (Air-Conditioning) Control System combined with an artificial intelligence video analytic system to manage air conditioning and temperature control in its Gyu-Kaku restaurant in Whampoa. The systems have improved customer comfort as well as reducing the amount of electricity used by air conditioners by around 15%.

Smart technology is also being put to work in schools. The TWGHs (Tung Wah Group of Hospitals) Lions Club of South Kowloon Nursery School won the Energy Saving Performance Grand Award in the SME/NGO/Education Institute sector by adopting energy recovery technology to cool incoming fresh air, cutting the cost of its air conditioning by around 10%.

Speaking at today's presentation ceremony, CLP Power Managing Director Mr T K Chiang said he was delighted to see different types of businesses and organisations embrace energy saving and environmental conservation measures. "Hong Kong's business sector accounts for 70% of the city's total power consumption," he said. "We always encourage our business customers to work together to achieve greater energy efficiency and reduce carbon emissions by adopting innovative solutions that address the challenges arising from climate change."

Mr Alfred Sit, Director of Electrical and Mechanical Services and guest of honour of the presentation ceremony, said he hoped the awards would motivate more organisations to adopt smart business solutions and support the development of renewable energy to accelerate Hong Kong's transformation into a greener and more sustainable smart city.

Five Renewable Energy Contribution Awards were presented to the top buyers of CLP Renewable Energy Certificates (RECs), including NTT Com Asia Limited, Tai Hing Group Holdings Limited, Courtyard by Marriott Hong Kong Sha Tin, Hang Seng Bank, and Citi, for recognising their efforts in buying electricity generated by or purchased by CLP from solar power, wind power, and landfill gas projects via RECs. By the end of October 2019, 2.8 GWh units of renewable energy had been sold through RECs.
