CLP Power Wins Four Honours in Construction Industry Volunteer Award Scheme

CLP Power Hong Kong Limited (CLP Power) has won four awards in the Construction Industry Volunteer Award Scheme in recognition of its initiatives to care for the community by using technology and creativity during the pandemic. The company was presented with a gold award in the “Excellence in Construction Industry Volunteering Project” category, a bronze award in the “Excellence in Construction Industry Volunteering Collaboration” category, and two further awards in the “Most Supportive Organisation” and “First-Time Participation” categories.

The CLP Volunteer Team has worked closely with business customers since the beginning of the COVID-19 outbreak to provide necessities to frontline medical staff in public hospitals. Among a host of community initiatives, it also distributed more than 10,000 anti-virus goody bags to underprivileged people, arranged virtual visits to elderly in elderly homes and day care centres, donated used laptops to underprivileged families, and organised computer workshops for parents to help their children with remote learning. The initiatives have seen CLP volunteers play a part in building a more caring society while fighting the pandemic.

CLP Power Chief Corporate Development Officer Ms Quince Chong said: “While COVID-19 has put extreme pressure on the society and our volunteer services, it is also the time when disadvantaged people need our help most. I would like to extend my heartfelt appreciation to our community partners and business customers for their support, as well as to our volunteers for their enthusiasm and hard work. This year marks the 120th anniversary of CLP, and we are committed to continue to serve the Hong Kong community with care and compassion, and to do everything we can to bring positive energy to society.”

A “Be Dementia Friendly - Home Visit” programme organised by CLP Power with the Caritas Community Centre in Nau Tau Kok received a bronze award in the “Excellence in Construction Industry Volunteering Collaboration” category. CLP volunteers have been visiting elderly people showing early signs of dementia in the Ngau Tau Kok area

since 2018, giving them coordination training to delay the onset of the condition while raising social awareness about dementia. During the COVID-19 outbreak, volunteers arranged phone calls and virtual meetings, using technology to continue to care for the elderly.

The Construction Industry Volunteer Award Scheme was launched in 2017 by the Construction Industry Sports and Volunteering Programme to recognise contributions to society by construction practitioners, and to encourage them to embrace healthy lifestyles and caring cultures. This year, 61 construction-related organisations, including Government departments, developers, contractors, sub-contractors, labour unions, and industry volunteer groups, as well as 10 Non-Government organisations, took part in the scheme.
