CLP Power Joins Hands with District Offices to Promote Green Lifestyle to 5,000 Families at Summer Carnivals

In partnership with four District Offices, CLP Power Hong Kong Limited (CLP Power) organised a summer holiday **E-Carnival** programme for low-income parents and children in Tuen Mun, Sham Shui Po, Kwun Tong and Tai Po. The programme, supported by HK\$1.5 million funding from the **CLP Community Energy Saving Fund**, promoted energy saving, home electrical safety and decarbonisation through a variety of games and talks by engineers to 5,000 families with over 15,000 participants recommended by 24 community partners in the four districts.

An appreciation ceremony was organised today to conclude the programme. CLP Power Managing Director Mr Joseph Law, Director of Home Affairs Mrs Alice Cheung, Liaison Office of the Central People's Government (LOCPG) Kowloon Sub-Office Deputy Director-General Mr Li Wen-bin and LOCPG New Territories Sub-Office Deputy Division Chief Mr Lan Tao joined the ceremony and engaged with members of the public through games that highlighted how energy saving and decarbonisation can be incorporated in daily lives.

CLP Power Managing Director Mr Joseph Law said, "CLP Power is committed to promoting green and low-carbon living through different programmes and channels. We want to thank the four District Offices, our community partners and school principals for their support to the **E-Carnival** programme, which made it possible for members of the public to learn more about home electrical safety and decarbonisation in innovative and interesting ways. It also helps enhance the parent-child relationship and build a happy family, with a view to creating a harmonious society."

Director of Home Affairs Mrs Alice Cheung said, "CLP Power serves more than 80% population in Hong Kong, at the same time promotes energy efficiency and environmental protection to the community. The **E-Carnival** programme is a public education initiative that enables low-income families to gain knowledge on electricity and decarbonisation, showcasing its care and support to the community. It has been the Government's vision to jointly build a caring and harmonious society with the community."

A total of 26 sessions of the **E-Carnival** were organised to offer parent-child learning activities during the summer holiday, attracting 5,000 families with over 15,000

participants in Tuen Mun, Sham Shui Po, Kwun Tong and Tai Po. Visitors gained electricity-related knowledge in a fun and interactive way from game booths with topics covering generation and power systems, Hong Kong's fuel mix, energy saving and low-carbon living. Workshops were also held to teach families about power safety and the smart use of electricity, passing on tips for them to adopt in their daily lives.

CLP Power launched the **CLP Community Energy Saving Fund** in 2019 to encourage customers to save energy while providing support for underprivileged households. More than HK\$200 million has been set aside from the **CLP Community Energy Saving Fund** in 2023 for a series of community support programmes, including a HK\$110 million Fuel Cost Subsidy Programme to provide one-off fuel cost subsidies to 150,000 families in need. The fund will also be used to promote energy saving and electricity safety to customers and the wider community and to provide support for students facing financial hardship.
