## CLP Power Hosts Its First EV Carnival To Promote Electric Transport with Industry Partners

CLP Power Hong Kong Limited (CLP Power) is hosting its first electric vehicle (EV) carnival today and tomorrow (19 and 20 August) to promote the expansion of green transport. The **CLP Low-Carbon Formula EV CARnival** showcases a variety of electric public transport and commercial vehicles suitable for driving in Hong Kong and introduces the benefits and latest development in EVs through a range of interactive game booths and workshops, helping Hong Kong on its journey to become a low-carbon smart city.

At the kick-off ceremony for the two-day event at the Construction Industry Council Zero Carbon Park in Kowloon Bay this morning, CLP Power Managing Director Mr Joseph Law said: “CLP Power plays a pivotal role in the local EV ecosystem. We support the policies set out by the Government in the Hong Kong Roadmap on the Popularisation of Electric Vehicles and we are committed to promote the wider adoption of EVs so that Hong Kong can achieve zero vehicle emissions before 2050.”

“CLP Power has launched a wide range of customer services to promote low-carbon driving in recent years, supporting the electrification of private cars and commercial vehicles. We are working closely with the Government and private sector to develop trials for electric public transport and commercial vehicles, continuously expanding and enhancing our power supply network and helping our business partners plan and install EV charging infrastructure.” Mr Law added that CLP Power would continue to work with stakeholders to strengthen EV promotion and encourage more drivers and the public to switch to e-mobility.

Environment and Ecology Bureau Principal Assistant Secretary for Environment and Ecology (Air Policy) Dr Kenneth Leung, who officiated at the kick-off ceremony, praised the different sectors of the community for teaming up to promote low-carbon transport. “The electrification of vehicles helps lower carbon emissions and improve roadside air quality,” he explained. “CLP Power plays a proactive role in promoting low-carbon mobility, supporting the Government in its goal of zero vehicle emissions

and carbon neutrality by 2050. This carnival enables members of the public to experience the benefits of electric transport and commercial vehicles and encourages technical exchanges in the transport industry.” Dr Leung said he hoped to see more corporations join the green journey and drive the transformation of transport in Hong Kong as EV technology advances.

The CLP Low-Carbon Formula EV CARnival is supported by a range of partners in the EV sector and the wider business community. Participating organisations will share with the public about net-zero electricity generation, introduce a blueprint for the electrification of public transport and discuss the evolution and operation effectiveness of electric commercial vehicles at a **Low-Carbon eMobility Seminar** at the event. Visitors will be able to see some of the latest electric commercial vehicles models as they make their first appearances in Hong Kong at an **EV Exhibition Zone**. They can also enjoy game booths at **EV Avenue** where they can learn about the benefits of EVs and pick up energy conservation knowledge. There are tracks for children to enjoy miniature car rides while other participants can compete in remote car races.

The fun-packed two-day event offers entertainment for visitors of all ages as well as valuable insights into the importance of electric transport and the rapid evolution of EVs.
