Over 100 Primary Schools Successfully Accredited under CLP Green Elites Campus Accreditation Programme

CLP Power Hong Kong Limited (CLP Power) held the final award presentation for its **Green Elites Campus Accreditation Programme** on October 24, honouring a further 17 schools and bringing the total number of accredited primary schools to nearly 120. The programme awarded participating primary schools as **Green Elites Campus**, in recognition of their efforts to implement green initiatives and has provided a comprehensive platform for environmental education for around 83,000 youngsters since its launch in 2014.

Of the 17 Catholic primary schools accredited in the programme's final 2022/23 academic year, four received the Most Outstanding Award. One school implemented a pollution-free healthy travel day, encouraging students to bring their own reusable items and eat fresh food, while another taught pupils about gardening and gave them the opportunity to grow plants and vegetables. A third school organised a vertical greening competition, turning award-winning student's design into a green wall on the campus rooftop. Pupils from the winning schools will join nature tours arranged by Green Power, learning about natural ecosystems and biodiversity at sites including Sha Lo Tung, Nam Sang Wai, and the Kadoorie Farm and Botanic Garden. *(See appendix for full list of winners)*

CLP Power Chief Corporate Development Officer Ms Quince Chong said, "I am very grateful to the programme's Steering Committee members, who come from different sectors and have served as judges over the years. They have provided valuable advice that allowed us to optimise the programme's content and witness the schools' outstanding work on environmental protection. From the school's reports, we can see that creative environmental protection ideas and the application of renewable energy are increasingly popular. All teachers and students are working along with the Government's environmental protection policies and move towards the goal of carbon neutrality."

Catholic Education Office Assistant to the Episcopal of Delegate for Education Ms Vu Im-Fan thanked CLP Power for inviting a total of 49 Catholic primary schools to take part in the programme over the past four years. "The schools participated in the programme during the COVID-19 pandemic and, despite having to adapt to changes in teaching, they never forgot to encourage students to embrace low-carbon lifestyles," she said. "CLP Power flexibly adjusted the programme activities to a blended learning format, enabling students to sustainably acquire environmental knowledge. When it was possible, students were encouraged to step out into the community and learn about environmental protection in different ways."

CLP Power is committed to encouraging young people to be greener and has launched a wide variety of public education programmes covering the entire education pathway from kindergartens to universities. The **Green Elites Campus Accreditation Programme** was specifically designed for primary schools, and CLP Power worked in partnership with four educational organisations and five environmental groups. Participating schools were provided with energy efficiency and assessment checklists, supplementary teaching materials, and a range of activities, including outings and workshops on low-carbon lifestyles, environmental protection, and energy conservation. Energy audits were conducted and a Green Elites Portal was established to help schools expand their environmental education and teach children about lowcarbon living in fun, engaging ways.
