# **CLP Power Teams up with the Yau Tsim Mong District Office** and Community Groups to Transform Substation with Art

CLP Power Hong Kong Limited (CLP Power) is committed to promoting energy conservation and improving living environment and social inclusion in the communities. On 28 October, CLP Power Chief Corporate Development Officer Ms Quince Chong and Yau Tsim Mong District Officer Mr Edward Yu Kin-keung joined members of the Yau Tsim Mong District Youth Development and Civic Education Committee, social charity SideBySide, and the CLP Volunteer Team to paint murals that combine district characteristics and green elements on the wall of a substation at No. 265, Shanghai Street Road, Mong Kok.

The Shanghai Street Substation Beautification Project is a joint initiative by CLP Power and the Yau Tsim Mong District Office. With an emphasis on youth participation, the murals were painted by the Yau Tsim Mong District Youth Development and Civic Education Committee's Youth Committee in partnership with members of SideBySide and the CLP Volunteer Team.

Ms Chong said, "Shanghai Street is our third substation beautification project. We are delighted to have the support of the Yau Tsim Mong District office to increase community participation. We believe beautifying the community through art not only creates a vibrant community spirit but also enhances people's awareness of the importance of energy conservation and decarbonisation. CLP Power is working closely with the Government and the Hong Kong community to move towards a low-carbon future."

Mr Yu also expressed his appreciation of the project, "The Yau Tsim Mong District Office has always placed emphasis on community development, in particular the participation of young people in community affairs," he explained. "This joint project with CLP power provides a platform for young people from different backgrounds to inject energy and vitality into our community through their creativity, and increases their sense of belonging. We hope there will be further similar projects to help build a more harmonious and inclusive community."

CLP launched substation beautification projects in August 2022 to connect people with their communities by decorating substations with murals promoting energy conservation, carbon reduction and green living. The Shanghai Street Substation is the third being beautified after substations in Haiphong Road in Tsim Sha Tsui, and Hung To Road in Kwun Tong.
