CLP Power Recognises Caring Volunteers who Supported People in Need During Pandemic

CLP Power Limited (CLP Power) held a Volunteer Appreciation Ceremony to recognise employees for their continuous contribution to volunteering services in partnership with non-governmental organisations and community partners from 2020 to 2022, using their expertise to support the Hong Kong community through the pandemic. Employees collectively contributed close to 30,000 hours of volunteer work over the three-year period.
