CLP Power and Sham Shui Po District Office Team Up with People in Community to Beautify CLP Power Substation in Shek Kip Mei

CLP Power Hong Kong Limited (CLP Power) and the people of Shek Kip Mei today (December 23) rolled up their sleeves to paint murals and transform the exterior of an electricity substation into a piece of community art through the Substation Beautification Project (the Project), which was launched last year to promote decarbonisation and connect people with the community through art.

CLP Power Chief Corporate Development Officer Ms Quince Chong and Sham Shui Po District Officer Mr Paul Wong Yan-yin joined CLP Local Customer Advisory Committees (Sham Shui Po) Chairman Dr Wong Chung-leung, senior citizens from the Shek Kip Mei Kai Fong Welfare Association and Caritas Ngau Tau Kok Elderly Centre, students from Wai Kiu College, and CLP volunteers to beautify the CLP Power substation at the junction of Nam Cheong Street and Wai Chi Street in Shek Kip Mei. The event gave people an ideal opportunity to celebrate Christmas by coming together to beautify their neighbourhood.

The project was jointly organised by CLP Power and the Sham Shui Po District Office, and the murals depict the history, culture, and unique characteristics of the district along with themes of electricity and decarbonisation. The work was carried out in a spirit of community participation as members of kai fong association, students, and senior citizens teamed up to paint the murals.

CLP Power Chief Corporate Development Officer Ms Quince Chong said, “CLP Power is committed to providing safe and reliable electricity to the people of Hong Kong and to improving their quality of life through community activities. Before today’s mural painting, CLP Power held three workshops in November and December to teach senior citizens, students, and volunteers the basic skills of mural painting and give them an opportunity to practise. Wai Kiu College student Koey Wong said, “I walk past this substation every day on my way to school and I would never have expected to have the opportunity to decorate it. The skills I learned in the workshop were very useful and I was delighted to be able to paint murals with my classmates and residents to make the whole neighbourhood more colourful and beautiful.”

CLP Power’s Substation Beautification Project uses murals to promote green messages about energy conservation and decarbonisation. The substation in Shek Kip Mei was the fourth being beautified after those in Haiphong Road, Tsim Sha Tsui, Hung To Road, Kwun Tong, and Shanghai Street, Mong Kok.
