CLP Power Hong Kong Limited**CLP Power Donates 1,000 Induction Cookers to Underprivileged Households to Save Energy Costs and Sets a GUINNESS WORLD RECORDS™ Title**

CLP Power Hong Kong Limited (CLP Power) today (17 May) set a new GUINNESS WORLD RECORDS™ title for the “Largest Induction Cooker Word” by laying out 1,000 induction cookers to spell “CARBON NEUTRAL” in an event held at Lok Fu Place to raise public awareness of decarbonisation. The induction cookers were donated to families in light public housing and transitional housing after the event to help reduce their energy costs.

The event titled “New Record-Breaking Feast: Electric Kitchens for a Greener Tomorrow” was attended by 350 residents from light public housing and transitional housing. Together with officiating guests Secretary for Housing Ms Winnie Ho and CLP Power Managing Director Mr Joseph Law, they wrapped rice dumplings and cooked them using the induction cookers. Induction cookers use less energy and produce fewer carbon emissions than gas cookers. According to research by the City University of Hong Kong, cooking rice dumplings with induction cookers reduces emissions by over 20% and saves energy costs by approximately 40% compared with gas cookers. Additionally, induction cookers do not involve an open flame, which reduces the risk of fire. The rice dumplings made by the participants were given to families living in light public housing and transitional housing to celebrate the Tuen Ng Festival.

Participants and officiating guests also laid out 1,000 induction cookers to spell “CARBON NEUTRAL”, setting the GUINNESS WORLD RECORDS™ title for the “Largest Induction Cooker Word”.

Secretary for Housing Ms Winne Ho said, “CLP Power has shown care to 1,000 families living in light public housing in Yuen Long and transitional housing by distributing rice dumplings and energy-efficient induction cookers during this festival period. The dumpling-making activities and booth games brought warmth and joy to the beneficiary families.” Ms Ho added, “The induction cookers provided by CLP Power will help alleviate the expenses of recently moved-in light public housing residents on purchasing electrical appliances for their new homes.”

CLP Power Managing Director Mr Joseph Law said, “This event demonstrates CLP Power’s commitment to decarbonisation and community care. By donating energy-efficient induction cookers to families in light public housing and transitional housing, we hope to reduce their energy costs while offering them the convenience and environmental benefits of electric cooking. Light public housing resident Ms Lee, who took part in the event with her granddaughter, said she was delighted with the induction cooker given to her by CLP Power. She added, “The induction cooker makes meal preparation faster. Electric cooking is safer and more energy-efficient than using an open flame. It reduces our household expenses and ensures my granddaughter’s safety while cooking.”
