CLP 'Sharing the Festive Joy' Creates Upcycled Household Goods and Celebrates Tuen Ng Festival with Senior Citizens

CLP Power Hong Kong Limited (CLP Power) hosted the **CLP Sharing the Festive Joy – Fun4Infinity** luncheon on 24 May, celebrating Tuen Ng Festival with 200 elderly people. In continuation with the upcycling theme, this year's programme saw CLP Power collaborate with Yan Oi Tong and Fusion HUB in holding six workshops for the elderly participants to create upcycled household goods by repurposing old clothing.

CLP Power Managing Director Mr Joseph Law, Secretary for Labour and Welfare of the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region Mr Chris Sun, Yan Oi Tong Chairperson of the 46th Term Board of Directors Mr Benton Ho, Fusion HUB Founder Ms Christie Hoo and CLP Power Chief Corporate Development Officer Ms Quince Chong attended the luncheon and officiated at the kick-off ceremony. Mr Joseph Law and Mr Chris Sun also joined the seniors in making "upcycled Tuen Ng dumpling bags" to celebrate the upcoming Tuen Ng Festival.

Over 130 CLP volunteers participated in the event, sharing love and care with 200 elderly participants. Together they transformed over 400 garments donated by CLP volunteers into unique seat mats and aprons. The elderly participants also gained energy-saving knowledge and skills through interactive games, engaging in lifelong learning and developing low-carbon living habits.

CLP Power Managing Director Mr Joseph Law said, "Decarbonisation is a top priority for CLP Power, and we host a range of initiatives to encourage the public to lead a low-carbon lifestyle. The **Sharing the Festive Joy** programme is one of our key community initiatives. In addition to inviting the elderly and the underprivileged to enjoy a festive luncheon together, the programme aims to enhance the knowledge and skills of our elderly friends through workshops, helping them understand waste reduction at source and deepening their environmental awareness."

Secretary for Labour and Welfare Mr Chris Sun said, "Encouraging lifelong learning for seniors serves multiple purposes. It promotes active ageing and strengthens their ties to society. Today's programme exemplifies that perfectly - it supports the Government's environmental objectives while empowering the elderly to learn new skills and showcase their creations."

One of the participants, Mr Lau, was inspired by the event, "I've many unused household items over the years but never wanted to discard them. Thanks to this event, I learn how to upcycle creatively and plan to continue doing so. I'm grateful to the CLP volunteers and Fusion HUB instructors for their guidance, which made exhibiting my work possible!"

Since the launch of the **Sharing the Festive Joy** programme in 2014, CLP Power has partnered with various non-governmental organisations and community groups to organise festive celebration activities aimed at expanding the social network of the elderly and underprivileged families. These activities also help raise awareness about home electrical safety and energy efficiency. To date, over 20,000 people have benefited from the programme.
