CLP Power Substation Beautification Project Celebrates Peer-to-Peer Coaching Sustaining the Environmental Mission with Colours

As part of its efforts to beautify the community, CLP Power Hong Kong Limited (CLP Power) has collaborated with the HKCT Institute of Higher Education (HKCT) to launch the **CLP Substation Beautification Project - Peer-to-Peer Coaching Programme**, inviting HKCT students to join hands with secondary school students and take part in a mural design competition to beautify three substations in Sai Kung, Sha Tin and Yuen Long. An award ceremony was held on 24 June to recognise the students who creatively integrated local landmarks, cultural heritage and environmental elements into artwork, helping to promote the concept of green living in the community.

CLP Power Chief Corporate Development Officer Ms Quince Chong, Yuen Long District Officer Mr Gordon Wu, Sha Tin District Officer Mr Frederick Yu and Sai Kung District Officer Ms Kathy Ma presented awards to the winning students. They also exchanged views with the HKCT tutors on the students' participation in beautifying the substations, sharing how artistic creation could enhance social cohesion.

CLP Power Chief Corporate Development Officer Ms Quince Chong said, "CLP Power is committed to promoting energy conservation and decarbonisation in the community, and we hope to instill the concept of sustainable development in future generations through the Substation Beautification Project. I am delighted to see students gain a deeper understanding of their neighbourhood through artistic creation while incorporating eco-friendly and low-carbon messages into daily life. The collaboration between HKCT students and secondary school students also demonstrates the passing down of knowledge and creativity, bringing new vitality to the community."

CLP Substation Beautification Project - Peer-to-Peer Coaching Programme is supported by the CLP Education Fund. As part of the programme, HKCT organised a series of workshops for around 50 students from Catholic Ming Yuen Secondary School, Tsang Pik Shan (Sung Lan) Secondary School and Yuen Long Merchants' Association Secondary School. Under the guidance of tutors, HKCT students led secondary students to create murals at Hau Tak Substation in Sai Kung, Kwei Tei Street Substation in Sha Tin and Fung Nin Road Substation in Yuen Long in the form of a group competition.

One of the participating students Heung Ka Chung from Tsang Pik Shan (Sung Lan) Secondary School said, “This experience deepened my understanding of my community and helped me realise collective effort turns visions into reality - whether creating murals or tackling carbon reduction. I hope our artwork inspires others to care more about the environment.”

The programme also placed strong emphasis on community engagement. With the support of the district offices, CLP Power hosted three substations mural painting days in May, inviting over 140 community members from different sectors, students and elderly to join CLP volunteers in painting murals to help beautify the community.

Since its launch in 2022, **CLP Substation Beautification Project** has beautified ten substations across districts in Kowloon and the New Territories, creating eye-catching attractions in community while combining environmental messages with arts, culture and creativity.
