CLP Power Launches E-Learning Assistance Programme for Fourth Consecutive Year to Support Underprivileged Students in Digital Transformation

CLP Power Hong Kong Limited (CLP Power) has launched the **E-Learning Assistance Programme** again this year to facilitate e-learning of the underprivileged students. The programme is run in partnership with the Subsidised Primary Schools Council, the Association of Hong Kong Chinese Middle Schools, the HKCT Institute of Higher Education, and the Vocational Training Council, and provides new iPad tablets to over 2,100 primary, secondary, and tertiary students from underprivileged households.

CLP Power Chief Corporate Development Officer Ms Quince Chong said, "The **E-Learning Assistance Programme** is supported by the CLP Community Energy Saving Fund and is in its fourth consecutive year with over HK\$22 million spent so far to help more than 7,000 students. Digital transformation is changing the way we acquire knowledge. By providing students in need with electronic learning devices, we hope that they can fully participate in their school curriculum, expand their knowledge through technology, and enjoy the convenience and fun of e-learning."

The CLP Volunteer Team held an activity day at the end of the summer holidays featuring a coding workshop for secondary school students who benefit from the programme. The students used their new iPads to learn how to make smart fans, inspiring them to explore the way technology can be used to improve lives, promote energy conservation, and contribute to environmental protection.

The Association of Hong Kong Chinese Middle Schools Chairman Principal Liang Kwunfan said, "Promoting the digitalisation of learning is a key element of Hong Kong's education policy. CLP Power's **E-Learning Assistance Programme** perfectly addresses this trend and plays a crucial role in supporting disadvantaged students. Through cross-sectoral collaboration, the programme will help schools implement the 'Bring Your Own Device' policy to enhance the flexibility and effectiveness of teaching."

Chan Wing-wun, a student at ELCHK Lutheran Secondary School, shared that the iPad has made learning not only more efficient but also more engaging. "Having my own iPad means I can study and search for information online anytime," she said. "In the future, I will also use artificial intelligence tools to organise my notes and analyse textbook content, making learning more effective."

About CLP Community Energy Saving Fund

For over 120 years, CLP has grown with the Hong Kong community, adapting to the evolving needs of society and supporting people from all walks of life. Under the current Scheme of Control Agreement, the CLP Community Energy Saving Fund (CESF) is funded by 65% of the incentives earned by CLP from achieving energy saving targets. The CESF has launched various programmes with the aim of supporting the underprivileged, boosting the economy and promoting community-wide decarbonisation.

From 2019 to 2024, the CESF distributed more than HK\$860 million, benefitting about 2.5 million underprivileged families and over 24,000 small and medium enterprises while saving more than 160 gigawatt hours of electricity. In 2025, HK\$240 million is allocated from the CESF to continue launching a range of community support programmes to support the elderly and the underprivileged, promote energy conservation and decarbonisation, and add momentum to Hong Kong's economy. The number of beneficiaries is expected to be more than 900,000.
