CLP Power Allocates HK\$44 Million from Community Energy Saving Fund to Enhance Energy Efficiency for Subvented Organisations

CLP Power Hong Kong Limited (CLP Power) has allocated HK\$44 million from the **CLP Community Energy Saving Fund** to launch a new **Subvented Organisation Energy Saving Improvement Scheme** in support of the HKSAR Government's decarbonisation goal. The scheme will help eligible subvented organisations and schools improve their energy efficiency, and the first beneficiaries are Haven of Hope Nursing Home and Haven of Hope Hospital under Haven of Hope Christian Service. Energy efficiency improvement works at the nursing home and hospital are expected to save a total of around 500,000 kilowatt hours (kWh) of electricity a year.

Under the new scheme, CLP Power conducts energy audits for eligible organisations, recommends energy efficiency improvement measures, and provides subsidies for implementing the recommended energy improvement works. Under CLP Power's recommendations, Haven of Hope Nursing Home and Haven of Hope Hospital will replace fluorescent tubes with LED tubes or motion-sensor LED lighting. Additionally, the nursing home has upgraded its fixed-capacity window-type air conditioners to inverter models carrying Grade 1 energy label, while the hospital will install solar power system and apply cooling paint to the roofs of two footbridges which connect its Main Block and the Trinity Block respectively, reducing both surface and indoor temperatures, thereby lowering the electricity consumption of the air-conditioning system. The nursing home has completed all energy improvement works, while approximately 30% of the hospital's upgrades have been completed so far. Upon completion of all the works, the nursing home and hospital are expected to save a total of around 500,000 kWh of electricity a year, equivalent to the annual electricity consumption of approximately 120 households or a reduction of about 190 tonnes of carbon emissions.

CLP Power Chief Corporate Development Officer Ms Quince Chong visited Haven of Hope Nursing Home yesterday together with Executive Council Member and Haven of Hope Christian Service Chief Executive Officer Dr Lam Ching-choi, and Permanent Secretary for Environment and Ecology (Environment) Mr Eddie Cheung, to learn about

the energy-saving and decarbonisation measures being implemented at the nursing home, as well as the subsidised energy improvement works under the new scheme.

Executive Council Member and Haven of Hope Christian Service Chief Executive Officer Dr Lam Ching-choi said, “Proactive energy conservation is one of the core strategies of Haven of Hope Christian Service in pursuing sustainable development. We appreciate CLP Power’s support in helping us better understand the energy consumption of our service units and in subsidising targeted energy improvement works. This effectively reduces our operational costs, allowing us to allocate resources to other service needs and to provide more focused services to our service users.”

Permanent Secretary for Environment and Ecology (Environment) Mr Eddie Cheung said, “Promoting energy conservation and emissions reduction in the community is a key component of the HKSAR Government’s decarbonisation strategies. We are pleased that CLP Power has launched the **Subvented Organisation Energy Saving Improvement Scheme**, which provides vital support to subvented organisations and schools in need. The scheme brings triple benefits by helping organisations achieve low-carbon transformation, enhancing the energy efficiency of community facilities, and contributing to Hong Kong’s carbon neutrality goal.”

CLP Power Chief Corporate Development Officer Ms Quince Chong said, “CLP Power is actively supporting the HKSAR Government’s decarbonisation strategies by introducing this new scheme through the **CLP Community Energy Saving Fund**, with a focus on helping subvented organisations and schools improve energy conservation and reduce carbon emissions. By offering technical support and funding for energy improvement works, we help them enhance their energy efficiency and achieve energy cost savings. This not only alleviates operational pressures for organisations but also promotes the development of Hong Kong into a low-carbon city.”

Under the **Subvented Organisation Energy Saving Improvement Scheme**, CLP Power provides one-stop energy services for eligible subvented organisations and schools, including free energy audits to identify opportunities for improving energy efficiency. Funding will be provided for implementing the recommended energy improvement works, such as replacing lighting and air-conditioning systems, installing solar systems, or implementing other energy-saving and decarbonisation measures. The funding cap is set at HK\$3 million per building and HK\$5 million per eligible organisation. About CLP Community Energy Saving Fund

For over 120 years, CLP has grown with the Hong Kong community, responding to the evolving needs of society and supporting people from all walks of life. Under the current Scheme of Control Agreement, the CLP Community Energy Saving Fund (CESF) is funded by 65% of the incentives earned by CLP from achieving energy saving targets. The CESF has launched various programmes which aim at supporting the underprivileged, boosting the economy and promoting community-wide decarbonisation.

From 2019 to 2024, more than HK\$860 million was distributed from the CESF, benefitting about 2.5 million underprivileged families and over 24,000 small and medium enterprises while saving more than 160 million kilowatt hours of electricity. In 2025, HK\$240 million is allocated from the CESF to continue launching a range of community support programmes to support the elderly and the underprivileged, promote energy conservation and decarbonisation, and add momentum to Hong Kong's economy. The number of beneficiaries is expected to be more than 900,000.
