CLP Hosts Ceremony Honouring Volunteer Contributions Celebrating Senior Citizens Day with Upcycling Workshops

CLP Power Hong Kong Limited (CLP Power) hosted the **Sharing the Festive Joy – Fun4Infinity and CLP Volunteer Appreciation Ceremony** today, bringing together over 500 elderly people, guests of non-government organisations and CLP volunteers to celebrate Senior Citizens Day. The ceremony also recognised the CLP Volunteer Team's contribution of over 12,000 service hours in the past year, demonstrating CLP Power's commitment to community care.

Sharing the Festive Joy is one of CLP Power's signature community engagement programmes. Building on the success of previous upcycling initiatives, CLP Power partnered with Po Leung Kuk, Sik Sik Yuen and Fusion HUB to host ten workshops for around 300 elderly participants. With the support of dedicated CLP volunteers, the elders transformed used paper bags into storage baskets. They also repurposed glass bottles into solar-powered memory bottles filled with cherished photos and toys from their grandchildren. Through these creative activities, they learned about waste reduction and renewable energy.

Officiating at the ceremony, CLP Power Managing Director Mr Joseph Law and Deputy Director of Home Affairs Mr Te Chi Wang appreciated the elderly participants' creative work and encouraged them to embrace lifelong learning. They also presented certificates of appreciation to outstanding CLP volunteers and non-government organisation partners for their dedication to community service.

CLP Power Managing Director Mr Joseph Law said, "Sharing the Festive Joy brings together CLP volunteers of all ages to celebrate with the elders and promote intergenerational harmony. The upcycling workshops blended creativity with education on carbon reduction and renewable energy. This helped participants explore zero-waste practice and sustainable living. Our volunteers' heartfelt efforts truly embody CLP's core value of 'Care'. We will continue to bring warmth to the community through diverse activities and work closely with the Government and our non-government organisation partners to promote a caring culture."

Deputy Director of Home Affairs Mr Te Chi Wang, said that the **CLP Sharing the Festive Joy** event continued with the theme of upcycling this year. The initiative integrated environmental education to help elderly people understand renewable energy. Through lifelong learning and hands-on participation, they could be able to explore new things, engage with the community, and build confidence and a sense of achievement. He also highly commended CLP Power's strong commitment to corporate social responsibility noting that its volunteer team provided a wide range of services, including rewiring, energy saving talks, and caring visits, benefiting elderly people and families in need, and demonstrating its care and sense of responsibility towards society.

One of the participants of the upcycling workshop Ms Tsang said, "This is my first time working with a solar-powered lamp. In the memory bottle I made, I placed some precious childhood photos with my parents. At night, the bottle becomes a little bedside light, filled with memories and special meaning. I'm grateful for the thoughtful guidance and companionship of CLP volunteers, which allowed us to learn new knowledge and share moments from our lives."

Since its launch in 2014, CLP's **Sharing the Festive Joy** programme has partnered with various non-government organisations, introducing new elements in response to evolving needs from the community. CLP volunteers accompany elderly people and low-income families at festival times, while also promoting energy-saving knowledge. To date, more than 21,000 people have benefited from the programme. The CLP Volunteer Team has been serving the community for over 30 years, with more than 1,800 members comprising current and retired staff along with their families and friends. The team supports a wide range of groups, including elderly people living alone, elderly couples, individuals with dementia or disabilities, young people and low-income families. Through diverse volunteer services, CLP volunteers continue to foster a caring and inclusive community culture.
