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CLP Climate Ambassadors Podcast Competition Inspires more than 100 Primary School Teams to Broadcast Messages of Low-carbon Future

CLP Power Hong Kong Limited (CLP Power) in partnership with The Green Earth and Metro Broadcast Corporation Limited (Metro Broadcast) successfully organised **CLP Climate Ambassadors Podcast Competition**, attracting entries from more than 100 teams of pupils in 47 primary schools. The competition gave children the opportunity to create podcasts on three environmental themes: *climate change, low-carbon living, and renewable energy*.

An award presentation ceremony was held on 20 January where three winning teams from YCH Law Chan Chor Si Primary School and S.K.H Fung Kei Millennium Primary School were announced. The winner in the *renewable energy* category, titled 'The Green Miracle of Algae', also received the Most Innovative Award and the Best Host Award (*See appendix for full list of winners*).

Speaking at the ceremony, CLP Power Chief Corporate Development Officer Ms Quince Chong said, "Climate change is one of the greatest challenges facing the world today. As Hong Kong's major power utility, CLP Power shoulders a particular responsibility to drive the low-carbon transition. Our goal is not only to provide safe and reliable electricity but also to support Hong Kong's target of achieving carbon neutrality by 2050, creating a sustainable living environment for future generations. The **CLP Climate Ambassadors Podcast Competition** encouraged primary school pupils to become Climate Ambassadors by using their creativity to advocate for energy saving and carbon reduction, lighting a flame of hope for our collective future."

Environmental Campaign Committee Chairman Ms Grace Kwok, who was an officiating guest at the ceremony, praised the competition for inspiring pupils to think about climate change and environmental protection, encouraging them to take personal action by embracing low-carbon living. "I firmly believe that promotion and education play a vital role in addressing the climate crisis, especially with the active participation of the younger generation, who are the future leaders of our society." Ms Kwok said. "Pupils participating in this competition are acting as ambassadors, using their creativity to promote environmental messages. I hope they will continue to share these messages with the public through their actions and stories, inspiring their families and friends to adopt sustainable living habits. This aligns closely with the Committee's long-term mission to raise public awareness of environmental issues

through a range of promotional and educational initiatives, encouraging everyone to take action to help Hong Kong achieve its goal of carbon neutrality by 2050 and meet the challenges posed by climate change.”

The competition, funded by the CLP Education Fund, invited pupils to produce podcasts under three themes, namely “Climate Change”, “Low-Carbon Living”, and “Renewable Energy”, with the goal of raising public awareness about climate change and carbon reduction while nurturing a new generation of Climate Ambassadors. The judging panel comprised representatives from CLP Power, green group, media, and the education sector.

Judges were impressed by the pupils’ creativity and eloquence and said the competition not only deepened their understanding of climate change but also allowed them to use their ideas to produce engaging, educational podcasts, providing a valuable environmental learning journey.

The winner in the *renewable energy* category, ‘The Green Miracle of Algae’, was created by three Primary 4 pupils from YCH Law Chan Chor Si Primary School and also won the Most Innovative Award and Best Host Award. Describing how they came up with the concept, team member Yeung Ho-sing said, “Our teacher told us about the relationship between the blue sand phenomenon in Hong Kong and microalgae, and we were intrigued. We spent over a month searching for information and discovered microalgae can reduce carbon emissions, be converted into biofuel, purify the environment, and even be used in green architecture. This experience taught us how every lifestyle choice we make has an impact on the Earth.”

CLP Power and the programme partners organised a range of pre-competition activities, including on-campus environmental talks and professional broadcasting workshops for 4,000 pupils to help them develop ideas and produce quality podcasts. The top three entries in each category will be broadcast on Metro Info and uploaded to the online platforms of CLP Power and The Green Earth for members of the public to hear.
