Community Art Transforms Shing Kai Road Substation New Kai Tak Landmark Brings Local Stories to Life

As part of 125th anniversary celebrations, CLP Power Hong Kong Limited (CLP Power) has transformed Shing Kai Road Substation near the CLP Headquarters into a vibrant public art space. Murals on the substation's exterior depict the past and present of Kai Tak and Kowloon City, reflecting CLP Power's longstanding ties with the community and turning the facility into a new landmark in the Kai Tak Development Area.

In addition, CLP Power brought together community groups and young people through workshops, a colouring competition and mural painting sessions, injecting fresh ideas and energy to the neighbourhood.

Officiated by Secretary for Culture, Sports and Tourism of the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region (HKSAR) Miss Rosanna Law, the **"Shing Kai Road Substation – Powering the Community with Art"** event marked the completion of the beautification project. In attendance were CLP Holdings Limited Chief Executive Officer Mr T.K. Chiang, CLP Power Managing Director Mr Joseph Law, Chief Corporate Development Officer Ms Quince Chong, Kowloon City District Officer Mr Ivanhoe Chang, and partners including Po Leung Kuk, Hong Kong United Youth Association and Sing Tao News Corporation. They joined secondary school students and members of the public in adding a finishing touch to the murals.

CLP Power Managing Director Mr Joseph Law said: "CLP Power has grown with Hong Kong and supported its development over the years. The Substation Beautification Project opens up our facilities as a 'community canvas', enhancing the surrounding environment while helping us connect with the society, promote energy saving and decarbonisation, and preserve collective memories. Through art, we hope to link the past, present and future, and tell the stories of the community."

Secretary for Culture, Sports and Tourism Miss Rosanna Law said that CLP is not only a good neighbour of Kai Tak Sports Park, but also a strong and reliable partner energising the district. "This initiative goes beyond environmental beautification. It reflects a collaborative effort among the Government, the public utility sector and the community, and demonstrates the integration of business, art, and public interests. I look forward to the mural at the Shing Kai Road Substation becoming a community landmark, alongside other community art projects that showcase Hong Kong's

vibrancy. The Government will continue to support diversified art development and work hand in hand with various sectors to integrate art into everyday life.”

The “**CLP Substation Beautification Colouring Competition**” attracted entries from nearly 3,000 kindergarten and primary school students. Participants added their own ideas and colours to the mural design of the Shing Kai Road Substation, incorporating energy-saving and low-carbon themes.

Launched in 2021 with support from the CLP Education Fund, the CLP Community Beautification Project invites the public to revitalise power infrastructure through art and innovation, showcasing local heritage while promoting sustainable development. With the addition of the Shing Kai Road Substation, the programme has now beautified 11 substations and 125 distribution boxes.
