CLP Power Launches Cool Home Pilot Programme Helping Underprivileged Households Beat Summer Heat and Save Energy

CLP Power Hong Kong Limited (CLP Power) has allocated HK\$3 million from the **CLP Community Energy Saving Fund** to launch the **Cool Home Pilot Programme**. The initiative will support around 500 underprivileged households by installing sun control window film and providing air circulation fans to reduce indoor temperatures, improve ventilation and ease the impact of hot weather. The measures will also help households reduce reliance on air conditioning in summer months, lowering electricity costs while promoting energy saving and decarbonisation.

Having served Hong Kong for 125 years, CLP Power has remained attuned to the community's evolving needs, rolling out a range of programmes in step with government policies to support different sectors of society and demonstrate its commitment to caring for the community. The **Cool Home Pilot Programme** addresses common challenges faced by underprivileged households in hot summers, including poor home ventilation and high indoor temperatures. Based on previously completed cases, the window film installed under the programme can block around half of solar radiant heat, reducing indoor temperature by approximately 1-3°C. When used together with air circulation fans, indoor air flow is enhanced and ventilation efficiency is improved.

CLP Power Chief Corporate Development Officer Ms Quince Chong said, "As global warming intensifies and extreme heat becomes more frequent in Hong Kong, we hope to make use of innovative solutions to improve the living conditions of underprivileged households. The programme helps reduce the use of air conditioning, easing families' electricity costs while promoting energy saving and decarbonisation. Its successful launch has been made possible by collaboration with District Offices, Care Teams, and community partners, reflecting a joint effort across the Government, the business sector and the community."

The beneficiaries of the **Cool Home Pilot Programme** are nominated by District Services and Community Care Teams (Care Teams) designated by District Offices in Kwai Tsing, Kwun Tong, Sham Shui Po and Tuen Mun, and more than 10 non-governmental organisations (including Subdivided Unit District Service Teams). These beneficiaries include low-income families, elderly people, and people with disabilities, as well as residents of subdivided units or basic housing units living within the CLP Power supply area.

CLP Power Chief Corporate Development Officer Ms Quince Chong earlier visited beneficiary households in Sham Shui Po with District Officer Mr Oscar Wong, and in Kwai Tsing with District Officer Mr Edric Leung, together with Care Team Captains from the two districts, to better understand their living conditions and needs.

A beneficiary living in Sham Shui Po Mr Ho said, “The weather is getting hotter every year, particularly in the afternoon when indoor temperatures can be very high. Using air-conditioning sometimes makes my breathing uncomfortable. The window film and air circulation fan have made me feel much cooler at home even during the day.”

Another beneficiary living in Kwai Chung Ms Ko said, “My flat is small and faces west, so indoor temperatures are often high. I am grateful to CLP Power for providing me with the window film and air circulation fan, which have helped relieve the heat.”
