## CLP Launches 125 Cheers Programme to Celebrate 125<sup>th</sup> Anniversary with the Elderly and Foster Caring Culture

CLP Power Hong Kong Limited (CLP Power) launched the **125 Cheers** programme with a luncheon for over 250 elderly participants on 13 June. In partnership with the New Territories Association of Societies, Kowloon Federation of Associations, Hong Kong Volunteers Federation, Tung Wah Group of Hospitals, Po Leung Kuk, Yan Chai Hospital, The Lok Sin Tong Benevolent Society, Kowloon, Pok Oi Hospital and Yan Oi Tong, CLP Power will host over 20 yum cha gatherings across 14 districts in its supply area from June to November. Through these gatherings, CLP volunteers will bring care and companionship to over 2,000 elderly people aged 65 or above, including those living alone and elderly couples.
